

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO BE FREE FROM JOB DISCRIMINATION AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT.

The Illinois Human Rights Act states that you have **the right to be free from unlawful discrimination and sexual harassment**. Employers may not treat people differently or harass them based on race, sex, disability, sexual orientation, pregnancy (including related conditions like menopause) or any other protected class named in the Act. This applies to all employer actions, including hiring, promotion, discipline and discharge.



REASONABLE ACCOMMODATIONS

You also have the right to reasonable accommodations based on pregnancy, religion, and disability. This means you can ask for reasonable changes to your job if needed for your disability, religion, pregnancy, recovery from childbirth, or pregnancy-related conditions like lactation or menopause.



RETALIATION

It is also unlawful for employers to treat people differently because they have reported discrimination, participated in an investigation, or helped others exercise their right to complain about discrimination.
